**Workshop Options:**

<p><b>1. The Urban Aboriginal</b> A workshop focusing on a discussion about the trial and tribulations of urban Aboriginal people</p>	
<p><b>2. Dispelling the Myths</b> A group discussion on the stereotypes and the realities of Aboriginal culture</p>	
<p><b>3. Residential Schools</b> A group discussion around the impact of residential schools on Aboriginal People</p>	
<p><b>4. The 4<sup>th</sup> R : Reading, WRiting, ARithmetic and Relationships</b> An opportunity to learn how Aboriginal People, educators and other workers in the educational system need to develop coping skills to address issues that affect Aboriginal people.</p>	
<p><b>5. How to the Fix the Situation</b> A discussion about the ideology of one oppression having many outcomes in an Aboriginal context i.e. The Leonard Peltier case</p>	
<p><b>6. Native Sensitivity/Spirituality</b> The gift of spirit is important to all nations and cultures. First nation's storytelling through group participation about their culture, history and spirituality.</p>	
<p><b>7. Dream Catcher</b> The storyteller will share and explore the subtle craft style and teachings of the First Nations people through making dream catcher.</p>
